On an area of more than 17,000 square meters, aluminum cast plates are manufactured and semi-finished products are cut to size there in the world's largest production center.


With a total investment of over 25 million euros and a resulting doubling of production capacity, Bikar considers itself well equipped for the competition of the future. "This is

also a good sign for the new apprentices, whose training has been of central importance to the Bikar family and its employees for many years. For example, the company's trainees have already been honored several times as the best in their year by the Chamber of Industry and Commerce and now occupy key positions in the company," according to a company press release.



Keyword training: Bikar-Metalle GmbH is starting the new training year with a new record. Six new and now a total of over 20 trainees have been employed by the Wittgenstein-based precious metal specialist since Monday. At the Raumland site, five of the six new team members were welcomed by owner Pascal Bikar on Monday. "Our trainees are confronted with their later areas of responsibility at an early stage and integrated into the work processes. In doing so, we provide targeted support, but also demand a high level of commitment and willingness to learn," Managing Director Pascal Bikar is guoted as saying in a press release. He is proud and happy to have set a company record with six new trainees. Thus, more than 20 young people will be trained in the future in the companies of the Bikar Group in Raumland and Korbußen. Five young people will be trained at Bikar as industrial, wholesale and foreign trade clerks. For them, the first day of work included getting-to-know-you games, a company presentation and tour, and joint group work. Sebastian Kaiser, a new apprentice as a machine and plant operator, also started at the company. He will spend the first months of his apprenticeship at the Wittgenstein Training Center (BZW) and therefore could not be welcomed on site.
